Item #6: NO DISCUSSION of new business. (In accordance with the Open Meetings Act, Title 25 O.S. § 311, new business is defined as any matter not known about or which could not have been reasonably foreseen within 24 hours of time of posting agenda.)

Item #7: Motion was made by Warner and seconded by Whitehouse to sign Resolution#2023-7 rezoning request CCZ-2097 Kenneth Rhoades per

recommendations of CCPC. Rezoning from Agricultural District to Residential Manufactured Home District to allow one manufactured home containing .50 acres more or less. Tract will meet all requirements and bring into compliance. There are similar zonings in the area. There has been no opposition. Applicant is present. The CCPC recommend approval on 1/17/23, along with the planning office. Property located at 36290 W. 28th St. S. Mannford, OK.-Wendy Murray, Planner. Vote as follows: Stephens - Aye, Warner - Aye, Whitehouse - Aye.

Item #8: Motion was made by Warner and seconded by Whitehouse to sign 2023 REAP Contract for asphalt overlay on W. 61st St. S. (Oakhurst), contract#230221, in the amount of \$103,100.00. Warner stated this is a joint project with Tulsa County, which received its own REAP grant for their portion of W. 61st ST. S. We are very excited to help in this joint project. Vote as follows: Stephens - Aye, Warner - Aye, Whitehouse - Aye.

Item #9: Motion was made by Stephens and seconded by Warner to sign 2023 REAP Contract for purchase of a used fire engine for Olive Volunteer Fire Department, Contract#230121, in the amount of \$38.000.00. The Board congratulated Jason Dobson on his efforts to get grants for his department. Vote as follows: Stephens - Aye, Warner - Aye, Whitehouse - Aye.

Item #10: Motion was made by Stephens and seconded by Warner to sign REAP Contract for 3" asphalt overlay on N. Division St., Contract#230229, in the amount of \$77,980.00. Stephens stated this is behind Liberty Glass, the unincorporated part. This should be able to help with the overall cost with project. Vote as follows: Stephens - Aye, Warner - Aye, Whitehouse - Aye.

Item #11: Motion was made by Stephens and seconded by Warner to Accept Bid#23-10 Title Services for June Tax Resale and pass for one week, until 1-30-23 to review. Bids submitted by Creek County Abstract and Title for \$70.00, per parcel and Anchor Land Group LLC for \$45.00, per parcel. Don Engle, stated he was ready to award, Engle asked Anchor Land Group if they have a bond on file with the county and an abstracting license filed in the county. Clark Daily stated I do not believe we have one on file and we are not currently a licensed abstractor, but we could provide a bond. Daily asked where do the funds come from to pay for this project, Engle stated from unpaid taxes. Engle stated that the state statutes state you have to have a bond in the amount of \$50,000.00 filed with the county and have an abstractor's license in order to do this work. Daily asked if this was true. We do this work every day for oil and gas, we would 100% guarantee the work and even consider pushing payment out until after the June Resale. Clark Daily, Anchor Land Group was present and asked the Board to pass out one week to review, as we are quite lower. Engle stated that within the Bid Specs under item #3, it states a bond must be on file and you must be a licensed abstracting company in Oklahoma and be in good standings with the Oklahoma Abstractor's Board. This language was just added this year, as last year's it did not have that language. We were also the lowest last year, as well. I would just ask the Board to give us the opportunity. Also, in the minutes last year, it was stated that we rescind our bid, Engle never reached out to us. You only received two bids, there are more than two abstractors here in the county. Warner asked Engle if we pass it out a week will he still meet his deadline. Engle stated he is not sure, but we cannot allow non-licensed companies do our jobs, statues state they have to have a bond and we are not going with someone without a bond or license. The Board stated we will pass out one week and review, Engle if you do not award to the lowest bidder you will need to submit a written reason, as to why you did not go with the lowest bidder. Vote as follows: Stephens - Aye, Warner - Aye, Whitehouse -Aye.

Item #13: Motion was made by Warner and seconded by Whitehouse to sign Resolution#2023-8 surplussing 21 work shirts, multiple colors and sizes for the County Clerk and Resolution#2023-8A disposing of the same to be junked and burned by District #1. Mortazavi stated all county patches have been removed. Vote as follows: Stephens - Aye, Warner - Aye, Whitehouse - Aye.

Item #12: Motion was made by Warner and seconded by Whitehouse to sign Resolution#2023-9 removing Receiving Officer Biesha Hillard and adding Kayla McElroy and noting a Scrivener's error on agenda stating Marcella McFarland for the Creek County Health Department (1216-3-5000-1110/MD1A, 1216-3-5000-1310/MD1C, 1216-6-5000-2005/MD2, 1216-3-5000-4110/MD3 and 1216-3-5000-2999/MD4). Vote as follows: Stephens - Aye, Warner - Aye, Whitehouse - Aye.

Item #14: Motion was made by Stephens and seconded by Warner to approve Utility Permit from Creek County Rural Water District #1 per County Specs for 2" water service, by boring, size of line 2", to cross Maple Dr. approximately .42 miles W. of Maple Dr. & Graceland Rd, further described as S. of the S.W. corner of Section 19, T17N, R11E in District #1. Vote as follows: Stephens - Aye, Warner - Aye, Whitehouse - Aye.

Item #15: Motion was made by Warner and seconded by Whitehouse to approve Utility Permit from Oklahoma Natural Gas Company per County Specs for natural gas pipeline, by boring, size of line $\frac{3}{4}$ ", to cross 6421 S. 42nd W. Ave approximately 1.86 miles W. & 1.27 miles S. of US HWY 75 & ST HWY 66, further

described as 2,265' E. & 1,851' S. of the N.W. corner of Section 4, T18N, R12E in District #2. Vote as follows: Stephens - Aye, Warner - Aye, Whitehouse - Aye.

Item #16: Motion was made by Warner and seconded by Whitehouse to approve Utility Permit from East Central Electric Cooperative per County Specs for fiber optic plant by boring and trenching, size of line 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ ", to parallel 245th St. S. and 241st St. S. near HWY 33 in Districts #2 and #3. Vote as follows: Stephens - Aye, Warner - Aye, Whitehouse - Aye.

Item #17: Motion was made Warner and seconded by Whitehouse to approve the amendments of the Creek County zoning regulations, including Subdivision Regulations with edits noted. The Board reviewed the proposed amendments and discussed Ag District portion with home beauty shops, Halfway Houses and defining Park. Wendy Murray, Planner stated both boards have review and recommend proposed changes. Vote as follows: Stephens - Aye, Warner - Aye, Whitehouse - Aye.

Item #18: Discussion and possible action regarding the American Recovery Plan 2021 funds directed to Creek County by the federal government. (1) Motion was made by Stephens and seconded by Warner to let for sealed Bid#23-11 for City of Sapulpa ARPA Project#1566-6.1-74066-4110 to be opened 2-27-23. There was discussion of this generator install at the main pump system. Also, City of Sapulpa has encumbered a P.O. for the publication cost to be paid from the city. Vote as follows: Stephens - Aye, Warner - Aye, Whitehouse - Aye. (2) There are no road or bridge projects to report. (3) Jana Thomas, Purchasing Agent stated that the Town of Mannford has received the recommended vendor's updated SAMS.GOV registration and I have verified that they are active. The motion last week had it to be awarded on 3/6 or with option to add to earlier agenda if recommended vendor Tanksco Inc. can provide updated SAMS.GOV information. They would like to have an agenda item on for 1/30/23 to award project. (4) Jason Dodson with Olive Volunteer Fire Department asked the Board when they might open the ARPA up for outside entities. Warner stated it might be late May, we need to get through some of the enter office projects. Also, if any entity would like to let the Board know of a request, I would encourage them to reach out to their commissioner and discuss request. (5) Goforth updated the Board with the quarterly report being filed on 1/20/23 and our status has been updated in SAMS.GOV, so hopefully we are moving in the right direction with assistance from ACCO.

Public Comment: Mortazavi reminded the Board that the Fair Board Election starts today 1/23/23 to 1/27/23 from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., they can sign up in the County Clerk's Office. The Board asked that a special alert be added to the website with information, as well.
